PROGRESSIVE MEN OF MONTANA. (written about 1901)

HOWARD A. BICKFORD is a native of Penobscot county, Me., where he was born August 14, 1854. His father,

Jabez, and his mother, Anna Dollif, were also natives of Maine, and passed their lives in that state. The father, who was a successful farmer and lumberman, dying in 1886, and the mother in 1876. Mr. Bickford began his education in the public schools of Bangor and finished it in those of Oshkosh, Wi. In 1873 he removed to Minnesota, and worked in the pine lumber woods about four years. In 1877 he went to Bismarck, ND, and joined a government expedition as driver of an ambulance team during the Nez Perce raid. After eight months of this service he spent the winter of 1881 hunting buffalo along the Yellowstone and its tributaries, and during the same year took up a squatter's claim on Fox creek, in the most fertile part of the Yellowstone valley, where he has since continued to reside and now has a beautiful ranch and an elegant home. Here he devotes his attention to raising thoroughbred Hereford cattle and a high grade of horses, and through them has been instrumental in materially raising the standard of the stock in his neighborhood.

In politics Mr. Bickford has been always an active and zealous Republican, and has been fruitful in good service to his party, having been a member of its county central committee during the last six years and doing faithful work in all its campaigns. Fraternally he is identified with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, being a member of Lone Tree Lodge No. 63, at Sidney.

In 1884 he was united in marriage with Miss Barbara Stewart, a native of Ontario, Canada, where she was born April 26, 1865. The marriage occurred at Newton, Mont. Mr. and Mrs. Bickford have three children, namely: Randall, aged sixteen, Eva, seven, and Marion, five. Mr. Bickford is a very progressive and enterprising man, with breadth of view and skill in his business, has an earnest desire for the advancement of his neighborhood and state along every good line of improvement. He is of a genial and obliging disposition, with a wide range of general information gathered by varied experience and an intelligent observation of men and events. He is highly esteemed wherever he is known, and looked upon at home as one of the most useful and representative citizens of the community.

I'm not sure why the article lists his father Jabez as dead in Maine. Jabez remarried and moved the remaining children to Glenn County, California before his death.

Newlon is located at present day Newlon Junction, where Fox Creek crosses SR16 (4 miles south of Sidney) Dawson County no longer encompasses Newlon. It is now Richland County.

1880 census shows Howard single and living alone in Dawson, Montana.

1900 census shows Howard living with wife and children in Dawson, Montana.

1910 census shows Howard living in Prescott, Yavapai, Arizona.

Howard moved from Montana to Prescott, Arizona before 1910. He took with him Randal, Eva and Marion. He worked there as a carpenter.

On May 5th, 1912 Howard entered into an altercation with another man in which Howard "did then and there willfully, unlawfully and feloniously make an assault on the person of Fred L. Campbell, with a deadly weapon, to-wit, a knife...".

Howard was convicted and sentenced to four years. He was received by the Territorial Prison at Florence, Arizona on August 5, 1912. Howard died 16 months later of appendicitis. He remains buried in the prison cemetery Plot/Row 10B.

Fred L. Campbell is shown on the 1910 census as a Sheriff in Yavapai County, Az.

Bought a "proved up" homestead 2 miles south of the Shapcott farm (SE 1/4-18-31-1W). Discovered that they were not farmers, however, and in 1907 they sold their farm to L.E. Thomas. Homer Thomas still owns the farm! Mary Jane and Oscar moved to Klamath Falls, OR, where brother, Sam Worden, had moved previously. She was a Jehovah Witness.

The Worden brothers bought and homesteaded several additional farms close to their original farm. 3 yrs later, in 1878, David and John Salter Worden's 2 uncles, James and Charles (bro's of their dad) started the Worden Brothers Nursery in Wellington.

In about the year 1843 MR. PAUL SALTER and family emigrated to Henderson county from the old oyster by of New Jersey, where he had up till that time in his life followed the vocation of fishing and oyster raising. At the time of his arrival in this county he bought a tract of 800 acres of land, of John McKinney, in and about what is now known as Salter's Grove, locating in the cabin first built by Mr. McKinney, on Sec. 25, T. 10, R. 4. To his first purchase he kept adding till he became the owner of 1200 acres of land. This honorable and energetic citizen was born on Staten Island September 11, 1788; was a soldier in the war of 1812. After his eight children were born in New Jersey he, with his wife, ELIZABETH CUBBERLY, and their children, removed to Ohio and soon after to this county. After growing old in years he divided his large estate with his children and retired to private life in the village of Kirkwood, where he died in 1863. JOHN SALTER, his second son, was born in New Jersey August 24, 1815, between Bergen Point and Jersey City, where he spent the greater part of his life, as did his father, engaged in oyster culture and fishing. In 1839 he married MISS JANE VRELAND, also a native of New Jersey, and a daughter of HENRY and LUCINDA (JEROLMAN) VREELAND, of Holland and English ancestry. In 1855 they removed to Henderson county, Illinois, and settled on the home of his father, where he still resides, having since become the owner of that part of the old home on Sec. 25, T. 10, R. 4. He has since settling here carried on the business of farming and stock raising. he also owns a home in Kirkwood, where he contemplates moving in the near future. Of his eight children seven are still living: ELIZA J. (now MRS. JACOB ACKERMAN), HENRY, LUCINDA, MARY A. (wife of THOMAS SALTER), JOHN, SARAH (wife of ISSAAC MUNDORF), EMMA (wife of JOHN SHOOK), the one deceased was RACHEL C., who was drowned while skating on the lake at Peoria when thirteen years old. Mrs. Salter is a worthy member of the Methodist Episcopal church.

Sgt. David Salter was the youngest child of 8 children born to Capt. Paul and Elizabeth Cubberly Salter. As a young boy, his parents and some of his older siblings moved from New Jersey - to Ohio for a short time - then to Henderson Co., IL.

On Dec. 24, 1854, David married Elizabeth Edwards, daughter of Thomas and Ann McBride Edwards. In the spring of 1856, they had a baby boy, Thomas. Sadly, young Elizabeth died a short time later.

On Dec. 4, 1856, David remarried. He wed Lucy Ann Barnett, daughter of John and Alice Moore Barnett. David and Lucy had two little girls - Alice and Elizabeth - named for their grandmothers.

On Nov. 27, 1861, David joined Company H of the 11 IL US CAV. Orderly Sgt. David Salter was killed on Oct. 5, 1862 at Kossuth, Mississippi, two days after the battle at Corinth. (See published letter from his commanding officer.)

DEATH OF DAVID SALTER

Corinth, Miss, Oct. 18, 1862

MR. EDITOR: - I feel it my duty to report to you the death of a noble hearted soldier from Young America, Warren County, Ills. DAVID SALTER, Orderly Sergeant in Company H, 11th Reg. Ill Cavalry, met his fate Sunday night, Oct. 5th, about twelve miles southwest of Corinth. I was ordered to place videttes on a certain road 80 rods apart for a mile and a half. Mr. Salter being better acquainted with the road than myself, offered to station the men, and when he had done that, knowing that the men were weary he generously offered to take the outside post himself, and here in the faithful performance of duty, which he volunteered to do for tired comrades, he received a shower of lead from the guns of a small party of Rebel soldiers or citizens (perhaps the latter) who stole upon him amid the darkness of night. We heard the firing, hastened to the spot, where his lifeless body lying on the road and his limping horse attempting to retreat, told us the sad story in language which we could not mistake. He is much missed in the company. He was cheerful, brave, and faithful, and if there is any honor in being a soldier and dying in defence our country, there are but few who share that honor in a larger degree than DAVID SALTER.

John Jacob Gemberling was born in Germany. He was the son of John Jacob Gemberling Sr. John Jacob embarked from Rotterdam, Holland, on the British ship "Polly", landing at Philadelphia, Pa. John Jacob took the Oath of Allegiance to Britain on 24 Aug 1765.

John Jacob Gemberling married Catherine Wolfensberger (c1740-1810) about the year 1767. She was the daughter of Frederick Wolfensberger (1727-1764) of Lancaster County, Pa, who was from the same area of Germany (Palatinate) that John Jacob was from. They first settled near Schaefferstown, Lancaster County, now Lebanon County, Pa. Here John Jacob was a nailor, farmer, and tavernkeeper. He served in the Lancaster County Militia during the Revolutionary War. He is listed in the Pennsylvania Archives as having taken the Oath of Allegiance and Fidelity before Henry Schaeffer, Justice of the Peace in Heidelberg Township, Lancaster County, Pa, on 22 Jun 1778 (PA Archives, v. 13, p. 425). Jacob was a Private in the 5th Company, 3rd Battalion of the

Lancaster County Militia. His company was commanded by Captain Nicholas Lutz. The family moved to Shamokin (now Sunbury), Pa, where they lived for a few years. About 1778, a 'Jacob' Gemberling is listed as a resident of Penn Township, Northumberland County, Pa, along with his brother, John Paul. (Annals of Buffalo Valley, Linn; 1877) John Jacob bought a tract of 300 acres of land for six shillings per acre, located just west of present-day Selinsgrove. His name first appears on local tax rolls in 1785. John Jacob Gemberling held several public offices. He served as a fence-viewer in 1789; located the road to the Isle of Que in 1800; and was appointed Overseer of the Poor in 1811, with Simon Ritter. Notes for Zachariah Harwood:

Zachariah Harwood, born in Hardwick, Mass., in 1742, was of English origin, being of the sixth generation from the first representative of the family in this country, namely, Peter Harwood, who, upon crossing the Atlantic, settled in Concord, Mass. Zachariah Harwood lived to the advanced age of eighty years. He served as a soldier in the Revolutionary War, and spent his last days at Bennington, Vt. The following obituary is from the Vermont Gazette, of June 19, 1821, published by Darius Clark, at Bennington: "Died, in this town, on the 6th day of June, instant, Mr. Zachariah Harwood, in the eightieth year of his age. He was one of the earliest settlers and fathers of this town, and was an industrious and worthy man. He was one of the heroes of Bennington battle, and through life maintained in steady practice the principles which early led him to espouse those political and to aid those manly efforts which resulted in the independence of his country. The New Jersey family, which solely interests us, became very early distinguished in the history of the state, and for a long time remained prominent. The tradition current in the family states that shortly after the accession of Charles II to the English throne (probably in 1664) several brothers from political and religious reasons came to this country. They landed at or near Boston, Massachusetts, where one remained, while the other two removed thence to the state of New Jersey. Of these one settled in Salem county and died without issue, leaving a considerable estate to his widow, Hannah Salter, who upon her decease left this property, situated in and about Philadelphia and New Jersey, to be equally divided among her own and her husband's relatives. The other brother, Richard Salter, the youngest of the three, settled in Middletown, Monmouth county, New Jersey, and became the founder of the branch we are about to follow. Notes for Jean La Tourette:

The Town of Osse in Bearn is now Basse Pyrenees, it lies 21 miles inland from Biarritz and three miles north of the border of Spain. it is situated at the fork of the River Nivee. (Picture of town available). Due to persecution of French Huguenots in France, Jean and Marie escaped to America. They may have sailed to England, then on to America. Their boat was shipwrecked off the coast of Nova Scotia. They probably landed 1st in R.I, in early 1690's (I'd say they probably landed in Nov Scotia - BA), then moved to NY city. They got married in St. Esprit Church of NY city but were previously married in France. Jean and Marie's marriage in New York was done to confirm or solemnize their marriage in France at a time when Huguenots were deprived of civil rights. Moreover, their certificates had probably been lost and the record destroyed. In 1695 Jean "took out" letters of denization. In 1697 he bought a house in the south ward of NY. They moved to Richmond Staten Island about 1698. Their house was the first one in Fresh Kills and had 75 acres. Later it was occupied by Henry LaTourette. Note that the LaTourette Park on Staten Island is named after this early family. Jean assisted in establishing a French church on Staten Island and was one of three trustees who held title to a half acre of land acquired in 1698 for the church. Religion was probably very important to Jean and his family. He was a carpenter in NYC, an assessor in 1717, warden of St Andrews church in Richmond in 1722, was elected Justice of Court of Common Pleas in 1723 and in 1724 was Justice of the Court of Special Sessions. In 1725 he was again elected Justice. He may have had a coat of arms. See Book by Kive of Iowa, 42nd St NY Library.

The site of the French Church, a place of worship for the many Huguenot families who settled in the area, is now called Greenridge. It was called Kleine Kill by the Dutch and Fresh Kills by the Colonial French and English. Also once known as Marshland, it became Greenridge around 1876.

Notes for Marie Mercereau:

Marie was in the Great Massacre of Schenectady in February 8, 1690, in which 60 of the 250 residents were massacred, 80 to 90 were captured and 60 of the 66 houses were destroyed. Marie was scalped and left for dead. She survived and lived with Jean in New York until about 1698 when they moved to Staten Island, took part in erecting a French church at Fresh Kills and purchased 75 acres of land and established their home near the church. The church was destroyed by Hessian soldiers during the Revolutionary War.

Notes for Dr. Samuel Worden:

Samuel was the first male Worden to be born in America. He became a large land owner and prominent physician.

Dr. Worden reserved the Worden graveyard by will as a burial place for the Worden family. He gave his name to Worden's pond.

Sometime before 1693, Dr. Samuel bought land in Rhode Island, because in a deed registered there on 19 September 1693, Werden's Pond is called by his name. (Old N.K. Land Evidences, Volume 1, Page 223 in S.K. Townhouse.)

On 8 July 1695, he bought land consisting of 250 acres from Benedict Arnold, one of the original purchasers of a tract of land in this "collony comonly called Pitticomcott." This was originally purchased by Benedict Arnold in 1658 and comprises the present towns of South Kingston and Narragansett. It's bordered on the South by Joseph Hull, on the West by what is now Worden Pond. [193, 364]

On 12 Feb 1696/7, Dr. Samuel sold his farm in the town of Yarmouth, Mass. to Isaac Chapman "except one half aker of land which I Samuel Werden except and reserve to myself and to my fathers posterity forever, lying square about the place where my father Werden was buried, out of the aforementioned farm, notwithstanding whatever is said above to the contrary, with free liberty of ingress and egress with horse or cart or foot from the common highway to same to have and to hold forever." He therefore preserved this land to all Wordens forever.[193] The deed is now preserved in the Masonic Museum of Nat'l Heritage in Salem. Samuel then moved to Kingstowne, RI and was active in its development. He was referred to as "Dr." but there is no record of his training.[364]

On Apr 5, 1708 he sold 250 acres in RI to Edward Greenman. On May 12, 1709, he bought 150 acres in Stonington, CT and gave 30 acres to son Nathaniel, 20 to son Thomas. He moved to the remaining 100 and lived there until his death. When his wife Hopenstill died there in 1715, he had notice of her death and burial inserted in the Norwich town record, where his son Thomas lived. [364]

Peter II's will

I Peter Worden of the Towne of Yarmouth in the Collonie of New Plymouth in New England in America about seaventy one years of age being weak in body yett in perfect memory doe make this my last will and testament.

Firstly. I bequeath my soule to God that gave it and my body to the earth to be decently buryed when Gods time is to remove mee out of this world by death.

Secondly. I make my son Samuell Worden my whole and sole executor to whom I give all my lands upon the neck called Equinett (?) necke with all the priviledges therto belonging to him and his heires and assignes forever with eight acres of land att the south sea, to the said necke soe likewise.

I give to my son Samuell Worden all my housing and land that I now live upon after his mothers decease both upland and marsh and orchyard and the land I bought to Mr. Allin, with all other lands due to mee from the Towne not yett layed out or from the Country as procured by the late warr with the Indians.

Soe likewise I give to my son Samuell my best bedsteed and my trundle bedsteed.

Thirdly. I give to my daughter Martha the wife of Joseph Severns a peece of marsh about three acres be it

more or lesse lying att the head of the Marsh above John Burgis his ditch, during her naturall life and after I give it to my son Samuell Worden to whom I likewise give all the cattle that hee hath bine possessed of by mee excepting two oxen.

Fourthly. I give to my loveing wife Mary Worden the proffitts and improvements of my housing and lands and orchyards that I now live upon during her naturall life, both upland and marsh with the land I bought of Mr. Allin and all my household goods and cattle for her support during her life and my will is that what of my goods and cattle are left after my wife dies shalbe equally divided betwix my three daughters Mary, Marcye and Martha.

Fifthly. I give to my son Samuell Worden all my estate in old England both land and other estate that came by my wife.

Sixthly. I give to my daughter Mary the wife of John Burgis, the one halfe of my forty acres of upland at the head of the lotts to her, her heires and assigns forever.

Seventhly. I give to my daughter Martha the wife of Joseph Severens all the cattle and goods, shee is alreddy possessed of my mee with one cow more att my decease and after her decease my will is that what of them are left shall fall to her two daughters now living.

Lastly. I give to my son Samuell Worden my Chist and my cloak.

Notes for William Bowne:

The first settlement at Salem, Mass., was begun in 1628. In 1630 about three hundred of the best Puritan families in the kingdom came to New England. Of these persons, all were respectable, and many were from illustrious and noble families. Among these came William Bowne and Ann his wife. They emigrated from Yorkshire, England, where a majority of the inhabitants were descendants of the Romans and ancient Britons, and settled at Salem, Essex county, Massachusetts in 1631. William and Ann Bowne left England on account of the cruel religious persecutions so prevalent in that country at the time. In about 1645, he removed to Gravesend, L. I., as Gravesend was settled by English emigrants from Massachusetts about that year. William Bowne was one of the Magistrates of Gravesend, L. I., in 1657. A party of twenty, including William and his sons, John, James, and Andrew set out in a sloop from Gravesend, L. I., in December, 1663, and sailed across the bay to what is now Monmouth County, for the purpose of purchasing lands of the Indian sachems. They made two or three more journeys from their homes on Long Island to the southern shores of the bay and finally purchased from the Indian chief, Poppemora and his people, the three "necks" of land known to the Indians as Newasink, Navarumsunk and Pootapeck. Having purchased the land of the Indians, "John Bowne, Richard Stout and three others, with their families, five families in all, came and made their settlement in the spring or summer of 1664. The Bowne family had actually settled at Middletown fully a year before the patent was granted.

The Worden family was in Dennis before 1639, when the official settlement began under the proprietorship of Anthony Thacher, John Crawe and Thomas Howes.

Peter Worden lived in Lynn, MA among early settlers of Cape Cod. Will dated Feb. 9, 1639 first of England to die there. Hatter by trade. Came to America on the ship the Anne.

Worden Hall was built in the 1880's as a meeting hall - it was so named because it is on the land originally owned by Peter who died in 1639 and has the dubious distinction of having been the first white man to die and be buried in what is now the town of Dennis, then East Yarmouth.

Worden's originally came from Germany, where the name was spelled "Worthen". This information came from the State Library at Albany, NY.

Be it know unto all men to whom this doth or may concerne, that I, Peter Werden, of Yarmouth, in New England, in the Plymouth Patten being very sicke, in this yeare of our Lord 1638, and on ye 9th day of February, do make my last will to testify unto all that I, Peter Werden, do give and bequeath unto Peter Werden, my only sonne, and sonne and heir, and in the presence of Nicholas Sympkins, Hugh Tillie, and Giles Hopkins, I do make him my whole executor, to whom I do give all my lands, leases, tenements with goods moveable and unmoveable town of in the town of Clayton in the county of Lankester. Likewise do I give unto Peter, my sonne, all my goods which I have at this present in New England. Notes for Robert Werden:

Because Robert died when his son and heir was only 11 years old and the lands in Leyland and Clayton were held by feudal tenure, William during his minority was liable to be treated as a ward of his superior lord. Isobel tried hard to avoid this, and was helped by her eldest brother and John Banaster. Court battles were fought between Isobel and Sir Edmund Huddleston as well as between Isobel and her brother Richard along with John Banaster not only for the control but the actual physical person William. We do not know if there was indeed bad feelings between Isobel and her brother and John Banaster or if this was a plan in the legal moves against the Huddlestons. These numerous court battles argue not only over the rights of William the heir but over those of the younger children. Although not conversant with English laws and customs of the times, I wonder if this has anything to do with Peter I's statements of rights he might have in England.

Notes for Isobel Isabella Worthington:

The Worthington family, of ancient English origin, possessed landed estates in Lancastershire and Devonshire, England, prior to 1236 A.D. Queen Elizabeth was once entertained at "Worthington Hall," in Devonshire, by a Mr. William Worthington. The surname Worthington, like many other family names, is derived from the locality where the first-known progenitor of the family resided. Its etymology is from three Saxon words, viz., Wearth-in-ton, i.e., Farm in Town. About twenty miles northeast of Liverpool, England, in the hundred of Leyland, and parish of Standish, is the township of Worthington. Here and on the adjacent manors resided for many centuries the family of Worthington, established in high repute from the time of the Plantagenets. They appear to have been distinguished rather by heroic acting than by the arts of courtiers. The main stock can be traced in the public archives as far back as Worthington de Worthington (20th of Henry III., 1236-7), the progenitor of all the Lancashire Worthingtons. The old hall at Worthington, where the family resided for seven hundred years, was pulled down not many years since.

Professor Childs, of Harvard University, says: "the name was originally spelled Weorthington, and is as old as any thing in England." Translated into modern English, it means, "the descendants of the men who settled the place." During the civil war between Charles I and the Puritans, the Worthingtons were staunch supporters of the Crown and the established Church; in consequence of which they lost the estates which they had held for more than four hundred years, and which had been bestowed upon their progenitors for loyalty and martial valor. Upon the accession of Charles II most of this land was restored to the original owners. The arms born by the various branches of the English family vary in several minor details, but all are of a general character and display agricultural devices: three forks on a shield; a sheaf of wheat resting on a wheel, and a garland of leaves with a goat surmounting it, etc., etc. The motto: Virtute dignum avorum = "Worthy to bear the dignity of our ancestors." They appear to have been landed gentry of local influence and importance, and several were distinguished divines. In 1635 two brothers of this name emigrated to Massachusetts, and have numerous descendants in the Northern and New England States.

The Battle of Agincourt was fought on 25 October 1415 (Saint Crispin's Day), in northern France as part of the Hundred Years' War.

The armies involved were those of the English King Henry V and Charles VI of France. Charles did not command his army himself, as he was incapacitated. The French were commanded by the Constable Charles d'Albret and various prominent French noblemen of the Armagnac party. The battle is notable for the use of the English longbow, which the English used in very large numbers, with longbowmen forming the vast majority of their army. The battle was also immortalised by William Shakespeare as the centrepiece of his play Henry V.
